

**Leviticus 9****Key Verse:** vs.4-6**Key Word:** “appear” vs.4-6**X-Ref:** Hebrews 5:3, 7:27;**Paraphrase:** After the seven days of consecrating Aaron and his sons, Moses instructs Aaron to make offerings. Then the Lord would appear to Aaron.**Examining the Text:**

- 1) Why did Moses instruct Aaron to offer a sin offering and burnt offering for his sons, along with a sin, burnt, peace, and grain offering for the people? “...for today the Lord will appear to you” -vs.4-6.
- 2) What was used in the wave offering? *The breast and right thigh of the sacrifice* – v.21
- 3) Describe what happened to the burnt offering after Moses and Aaron came out of the tent of meeting. *Fire came out from the Lord and consumed it.* – v.24.

**Leviticus 10****Key Verse:** v.3**Key Word:** “unauthorized” v.1**X-Ref:** Leviticus 8:1-36; John 4:24**Paraphrase:** Nadab and Abihu attempt to worship God in a way that was not commanded. They died for their sins. The Lord tells Aaron not to drink wine or strong drink when they are serving God. They needed to remember what is unclean and what is clean. Then sin sacrifices are offered.**Examining the Text:**

- 1) Verse 1 records the phrase “which he had not commanded them.” Contrast this with chapter 8 and record your thoughts. *Eleven times the word “commanded” is used in chapter 8. Here in chapter 10, Nadab and Abihu tried to do things their own way. This was acceptable to God.*
- 2) Why did Moses warn Aaron not to let his hair down or tear his clothes? *These are signs of mourning. God’s punishment was just. If Aaron openly mourned, Moses warned he would die, and God’s wrath would come upon the nation* – v.6.
- 3) What is the difference between the sin of Nadab and Abihu and what Aaron did by not eating the sin offering and not bringing the blood into the Holy place? *After all that happened that day, Aaron was unable to complete the task. Nadab and Abihu added to God’s worship as they pleased. (John 4:24).*

**Leviticus 11****Key Verse:** vs.45-47**Key Word:** “unclean” v.4**X-Ref:** Deuteronomy 14; 1Peter 1:16**Paraphrase:** This chapter discusses the laws of things that can and cannot be eaten.**Examining the Text:**

- 1) What three characteristics were required for an animal to be considered “clean” and edible? *1) Parts the hoof 2) Cloven footed 3) Chews the cud* – v.3.
- 2) List the animals specifically mentioned in verses 1-8 as “unclean.” *Camel, rock badger, hare, and pigs.*
- 3) If you touched the carcass of an unclean animal, how long were you considered unclean? *Until evening* – vs.24, 28.

**Leviticus 12****Key Verse:** v.8c**Key Word:** “conceives and bears” v.2**X-Ref:** Luke 2:24; John 7:22; Acts 15:1**Paraphrase:** This chapter contains laws concerning purification after childbirth.**Examining the Text:**

- 1) Compare and contrast the differences between the birth of a male child and the birth of a female child.

<b>Male:</b>	<b>Female:</b>
a) Mother unclean 7 days	14 days
b) Child circumcised 8 <sup>th</sup> day	N/A
c) 33 days of purification	66 days
d) Same offerings for burnt offering and sin offerings	
- 2) As usual, what sacrifice could be offered if a person could not afford a lamb? *A second turtle dove or pigeon* – v.8
- 3) Who was responsible for bringing this sacrifice? *The mother* – vs.6-8.

**Leviticus 13****Key Verse:** v.9; vs.45-46**Key Word:** “leprous” v.2**X-Ref:** Luke 17:12**Paraphrase:** *Laws regarding leprosy in people and garments are covered in this chapter.***Examining the Text:**

- 1) If a person came to the priest with a swollen or reddish spot on his skin, but it appeared to be only skin deep and the hair had not turned white, what would happen? The priest would “shut him up” for 7 days – v.4; 19.
- 2) If a man’s hair falls out, what is the diagnosis? *He is bald and clean – v.40*
- 3) If someone had a leprous disease, where did they live? “*outside the camp*” – v.45-46
- 4) What was to be done with a persistent leprous diseased garment? *Burned – v.52*

**Leviticus 14****Key Verse:** v.2; v.34**Key Word:** “cleansing” v.2**X-Ref:** Matthew 8:4; Hebrews 9:19**Paraphrase:** *Here we find the laws for the cleansing of lepers and houses.***Examining the Text:**

- 1) When a once leprous man was declared clean and allowed back into the camp, where did he spend the next 7 days? *Outside his tent -v.8.*
- 2) How much was a “log” (ESV) of oil? *About 1/3 quart or 0.3 liter.*
- 3) When leprous disease was in the walls of a house and the stones had to be removed, where were they taken? *Outside the city to an unclean place – v.45*
- 4) List the elements used in the sacrifice for cleansing. *2 birds, cedar, scarlet yarn, hyssop – v.4.*

**Leviticus 15****Key Verse:** v.31**Key Word:** “discharge” v.2**X-Ref:** Matthew 9:20**Paraphrase:** *This chapter covers laws regarding purity and discharges that made a person unclean for a time.***Examining the Text:**

- 1) If you came in contact with a man who had a discharge of blood, what did you have to do? *Wash clothes and bathe body – v.5.*
- 2) What types of offerings were made with the two birds that were brought for the sacrifice? *Burnt and sin offering – v.30.*
- 3) Why were these laws important? *Because being in the midst of the tabernacle while unclean defiled the tabernacle and could mean death for the individual. – v.31.*
