Examining the Text:

- 1) On which day and month were the tops of the mountains visible?
- 2) How long was Noah on the ark?
- 3) What is the first thing Noah did after exiting the ark and what can we learn from this?
- 4) According to verses 21 & 22, what was in the heart of the Lord?
- 5) What conclusions can we draw from verse 22?

## Genesis 9 – Include Key Verse, Key Word, Paraphrase, and Cross References every day.

Examining the Text:

- 1) How does the relationship between man and animal change after the flood?
- 2) Many things are mentioned about the covenant that God makes in this chapter. Make a list of those things.
- 3) Why was Ham cursed by Noah?
- 4) How long did Noah live after the flood?

## Genesis 10 – Write down the page number and name of the reference for the Word Study.

Examining the Text:

- 1) When did Noah's sons and their wives first have children? Were there any babies born on the ark?
- 2) Where did Japheth's descendants settle? (If you are using a KJV you will need to look at another translation).
- 3) Word Study: "mighty man" (v.8): (Use a concordance, Bible dictionary, and/or commentary to better understand the word.)
- 4) Where did Shem's descendants settle?
- 5) Where did Ham's descendants settle?

## Genesis 11 – Use a separate notebook or journal to record your answers.

Examining the Text:

- 1) From vs.1-9, make a list of the words that reveal to us the minds of the people and what they were focused on.
- 2) Make a list of the people in this chapter and how old they were when they died. What do we learn?
- 3) Using a Bible map, estimate the distance from Ur to Haran and Haran to Canaan.

## Genesis 12 – Consider underlining and/or highlighting key verses and words.

Examining the Text:

- 1) How old was Abram when God called him?
- 2) Where was Abram when he made altars in this chapter?
- 3) Why did Abram go to Egypt?
- 4) List the consequences of Abram and Sarai's lie.

## Genesis 13 – A good paraphrase will help you remember what the chapter is about.

Examining the Text:

- 1) In this chapter, what does the phrase "called upon the name of the Lord" signify?
- 2) In verse 3, what does the word "tent" tell us about Abram? How are Christians like Abram in this area?
- 3) "Strife" caused Abram and Lot to go in different directions. Describe the differences between the lands in which each man dwelt.
- 4) Each move in Abram's life is marked by what?

## Genesis 14 – Cross References: O.T. passages are often mentioned in the N.T.

Examining the Text:

- 1) Make a list of the nine kings and the land in which they ruled.
- 2) Word Study: "bitumen pits"
- 3) Where was Lot dwelling when he was captured?
- 4) Who was Melchizedek?
- 5) Why did Abram refuse to take the spoils of war? And who were Abram's allies?
